
'To whom it may concern'

Reier completed a significant installation of showcases at the British Museum in June 2007. The showcases are for the Britain & Europe, Early Europe & Middle East and Ancient Iran displays in galleries 51, 52 and 53. Some of the showcases also include case conditioning units also supplied and installed by Reier. The showcases have fibre optic lighting and are accessed via a mixture of hinged and sliding frameless glass doors.

Reier interpreted the design commissioned by the Museum, and built the bespoke cases to follow the Museum's design. As part of the design process, Reier first built a full size mock up in their factory, and then a sample case in the Museum which tested satisfactory for air tightness to meet the Museum's specification. The cases were prefabricated in Reier's factory and assembled in the Museum by Reier's workmen. The work was completed in time to meet the galleries' planned opening date.

Reier have now been appointed as one of the Museum's 4 showcase framework contractors to supply showcases, following an OJEU tendering process. They are currently manufacturing showcases for the new PDF gallery.
